It's time for your Booster! But what about a spiritual booster?

We all know now that we're going to be living with COVID-19 for the foreseeable future, and the importance of vaccination to ensure that we can stay healthy and productive members of our community. This became very clear to me as I recently attended a booster shot event (including getting the annual flu as well!) – this is the new normal, and something I should plan for just as I plan to see the dentist, eye doctor, etc. It also caused me to pause and reflect on my overall level of awareness about the virus – I had really 'checked out' once I got the first vaccination and things appeared back to be getting back normal. I started questioning some of my behaviors – was I practicing good hygiene around preventive care? Making sure I have masks handy for when I visit my mother in group living or other healthcare providers? Was I overall simply being too cavalier about my health?

It struck me as I was thinking about this month's Deacon's Bench that there is an interesting parallel with our spiritual life. At times I can get very engrossed in my day to day that I am 'checked out', even when I'm present at church! What is the 'booster' that gives me the strength and awareness that I need to be just as diligent about my spiritual health as I do my physical health? For me – I get a spiritual 'boost' through engagement with our church, and Autumn is a special time of year as we tend to re-engage after a busy summer, especially as our church activities start to look a little more like 'normal'. For starters, my family and I try to prioritize our church time, and I spend the first few minutes trying to get in the right mindset and get the day to day out of my head. This allows me to focus and really pay attention to what is going on - the announcements, the music, and of course the ministry and sermon. There are also lots of wonderful ways to engage in the wider church – I personally enjoy and feel blessed to be asked by our congregation to serve on the Diaconate, and I would recommend it to anyone interested. But there are many options – church committees ranging from the Trustees (with oversight for property and finance) to those that deal with the direct ministry areas we are about as a church (worship, member care, missions and outreach beyond our church, fellowship within our church, education). And the social calendar of events is returning, such as the Chicken Pie Supper, the Cake Auction, and others. I know not everyone is able to attend weekly service every week or the other activities, but I encourage you to get your 'booster' in the way that works for you. We stream every service now which can be accessed on the web page (https://cantoncenterchurch.org/), and we continue to keep everyone informed via the Church Mouse.

Scrip cards are available for over 600 retailers – from large chain stores and restaurants to smaller national shops, and lots of online retailers. We even have Visa cards available in various denominations – with no activation fee that you would pay if you bought them in the store. Of course, grocery stores remain our most popular cards - Stop & Shop and Shop Rite are available every week in different denominations. The ways you can use Scrip gift cards are only limited by your imagination! And don't forget that every card you purchase – big or small – earns money for our church.
