As the newest deacons, Phil Doyle and I, are learning the way and remembering the old ways, too. We are learning to speak with the supply pastor for our Sundays that we are duty deacons, check the phone messages over the weekends, make sure the hymn numbers, candles and microphones are out and ready to go to name a few. One of the old items we are getting back to now that COVID protocols are done is to remember the high school graduates in a worship service.

On Sunday, June 18th we congratulated Josh Levine and Julia Baldwin as recent Canton High School graduates (and former Kindergarten students of mine!) Josh was able to be at our service but Julia was out of the state at a family wedding.

The deacons have the tradition of giving a bag of items as a remembrance of their time growing up in our Sunday School and church. The graduates receive a letter and a bag of items and the list and reason why each was in the bag. We presented Josh and did a show and tell (a K term!) of the items.

Here is the list and the explanation of the items:

The Bag: Remember your childhood and all who were a part of it. Note the **netting** - it's light and a bit frivolous. Inconsequential and yet strong: it can support many times its own weight. You can, too. You are stronger than you know.

Space: There's a saying that if you want something in your life, you have to make room for it. Find what energizes you and makes you come alive, whatever that is, and be sure there is space for it in your life: friendship, music, education, subjects for which you discover a deep passion, a vacation that calls your name. Think of this as God's voice stirring in you. That's what the space in your bag is for.

An envelope addressed to the church: Inside it is a change-of-address card you could use to let us know where you are, and a **prayer request card** that you can send to us whenever you want to, so we can lift up your joys or concerns. (Or you may email us this info, anytime.)

Pencil: Always work hard to keep your mind and body "sharp." You've been blessed with gifts and talents, some of which you haven't yet discovered. Now it the time to sharpen them and use them to make a positive impact not he world.

Eraser: You will mess up from time to time, like all of us, and that's okay, Just know that God will love you through all of life's snags. Use an eraser to make amends, learn from your mistakes, and move on.

Pipe cleaner: Play, be creative, be flexible! If you don't like the way your life is taking shape, remember that you can do something to change its shape.

Granola bar: Take care of yourself as you journey, feed your body and spirit well. Never forget that you are a child of God.

Touch-screen wipes: Just as with the eraser, if you're not getting the desired responses, if life sometimes seems blurred, try cleaning things up from your side.

Paper umbrella: Have fun, enjoy your travels and fellow travelers! Being a Christian isn't all serious stuff. Remember to live joyfully in the world God has created for you.

Hershey kisses: At your baptism, your church family promised to love you and raise you in Christian love. This is a reminder of that deep affection that will continue throughout your life.

Cherry Brook rock: Remember your spiritual home and the foundation of your Christian faith. Just as this rock (taken from the brook behind the church) was shaped, in part, by the water flowing over and around it, so the Living Water of baptism has helped to shape you. May you continue to be refreshed all along the way.

Candle: This candle was used in a Christmas Eve Candlelight service at our church. Know that God's light will guide your way, but you'll also need to reach out and respond to it. But it's always there, and some consciousness on your part can rekindle it, because God's love for you never, ever goes out!

Sand: This bit of sand is from the desert box of Godly Play, which may have been an important part of your church school learning. In the stories of the Bible, a desert is usually a place of wandering and testing, a place where the people of God learn to rely on God as they encounter challenges. On a beach, sand mixed with water can molded into a thousand creative shapes. May you find all the creativity you will need along your way, trusting God, to meet the challenges that will come.

As the deacons of the church, we hope that the graduates will let God continue to show His love and guidance in seen and unseen ways and wish them the best for their future!
