

I was always surprised at how few people approached us and welcomed us to those Churches. They just didn't seem very friendly (maybe it was my Southern drawl). I decided that being standoffish must be a New England thing. We did eventually join a Church in Ellington and found everyone there to be warm and friendly once you got to know them.

All Churches want to grow, especially these days when overall Church membership is in decline in the U.S. According to Gallup, 70% of adults were members of religious organizations in 2000. That number has declined to 47% today. Gone are the days when all a Church needed to do was open its doors to fill the pews.

We are planning to welcome some new members to our congregation in late September. One way you can help add people to that process is by warmly greeting people you don't recognize at Church. You don't have to put them on the spot or twist their arm to join. Simply say something like, "I don't believe we've met before. My name is \_\_\_\_\_\_." If they volunteer that they are visiting, you can say, "Please let me know if you have any questions." Also feel free to introduce them to the Minister, Deacons or other Members who might be in the area.

As I reminisce about the Churches our family visited when we first moved to Connecticut I can't help but think, "They could have had us with a warm welcome!"



This document will allow UCC ministerial candidates across the country to learn about us and decide whether to apply to become our pastor. The settled pastor search committee plans to begin working on this document over the summer, so that we can receive feedback on it at a Second Hour in September and post our job opening soon after.

To be sure our profile draft reflects the perspectives of all members, we ask that you take a few minutes to fill out a simple survey. The first part seeks your thoughts about our church and our next pastor; the second part—asks for some demographic information that the UCC church profile form requires from us. All responses will—be anonymous (unless you choose to identify yourself in your responses) and kept strictly confidential; only the members of the settled pastor search committee will see them.
