Message from the pastor...

As the Advent season unfolds, let us pause to reflect on the profound meaning of our journey to Christmas Day. It is a time of spiritual reflection on the importance of our Christian foundation; a time to reflect on the messages of our Lord Jesus. The Christmas message goes far deeper. It announces the entrance of God into human history in Emmanuel. It is Heaven descending to Earth.

How do we experience this trek to Bethlehem in our modern-day world. The day following Thanksgiving watch out for little green men and women, or in other words, frantic elves, sprinting through malls, racing from store to store, like they are preparing for a marathon. These are difficult times. There are for many feelings of division, loss, dread and that there is a lack of civility towards one another. Here I share some scriptures that speak to us today and how we might love one another both now and in the future.

John 13:34-35

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

1 John 4:7-12, 16b

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. 9 This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. 10 This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. 11 Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us....16b God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8a

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 8 Love never fails.

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. 3 Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

1 Peter 4:8

Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.

Colossians 3:14

And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

1 John 4:16-17

And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them.

Philippians 4:6-8

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. 8 Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

We need to seek after God and pray that he will help us to see the good in those who hold different points of view, that He will help us to walk together as brothers and sisters in Christ with a united heart of purpose and service. That we show one another love, compassion, and understanding during these times of change and uncertainty. Let peace and civility rule both in our innermost thoughts and in our outward behavior.



Stewardship has been a theme this past month. We heard from Jennifer and Paul about the value of our church experience to our lives, our sense of belonging and our ever-expanding love for God's creation. In Church School we shared the parable of the coins (Mark 12: 41-44) with the young folks. Jesus observed the rich giving large sums of money to the treasury, then a poor widow came and put in two small coins. Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury".

In this parable one of the themes is giving from the heart and placing great value on the treasures that lie within. We asked the children "What can you give when you feel you have so little, or you feel you are so small?" The answers came rapidly and thoughtfully. They spoke of kindness, love, joy, a helping hand, understanding, hugs, and time. We then challenged them with an activity where they had to use these gifts to work together to get all members of the group across an area with few spots to stand on while also rescuing the identified gifts from the floor. They then reflected on their process and named the ways in which they gave to each other. We ended with an echo prayer of thanksgiving for all our God-given gifts and our willingness to share them with the world. We are inviting the children to participate in the church service during Advent both as acolytes, lighting the candles during the prelude, and reading short passages as we assemble the crèche on the altar.

May you join with us in receiving and sharing all Christ's love and grace throughout the holiday season!

Thank you also to those of you donated to buy gift cards for Wellmore and for Canton Senior and Social Services. This congregation is always so generous to these organizations. We'll update you on the final totals when we have them.



More Opportunities to help others. -December brings so many fun and exciting times, but it also emphasizes how many people continue to have needs. W we have so many opportunities to live our faith by helping others. We know we're setting a big challenge, but we also know the generosity of this congregation.

<u>The Christmas Tree</u>. We are once again collecting winter scarves, hats, gloves, mittens, and socks to be given to various organizations. These can be placed on or under the Christmas Tree in the sanctuary. However, please place them in a plastic bag so we don't have to pick pine needles out of them. These will be collected all month.

<u>Cherry Brook Health Care</u>-We have been asked to help Cherry Brook Health Care provide some simple gifts for their 90 residents, most of whom are on Medicaid and have very limited income. They have requested small items including pens and pencils, adult coloring books, crossword and word searches, lap blankets, small mirrors, 2025 calendars, picture frames, pens and pencils, small notebooks, sticky notes, hand creams, pocket mirrors, magnifying glasses, scarves and cotton socks. We will collect these items Dec. 1st and 8th and will place a box near the Christmas tree for the donations.

<u>The Christmas Fund</u> - This year we are also returning to our church's tradition of collecting The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund. This fund is a Special UCC Mission Offering administered through the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance, the charitable arm of the Pension Boards. Funds provide direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties. Active and retired clergy, lay employees, and their surviving spouses may be eligible for the Supplementation of Small Annuities, Supplementation of Health Premiums, Emergency Grants, and/or Christmas "Thank You" Gift Checks. The Christmas Fund collection will be taken on December 15th and 22nd. Envelopes will be provided on those dates. <u>Please write checks to: FCCCC with memo: "Christmas Fund"</u>

<u>Christmas Eve Offering</u> - Monies collected during the Christmas Eve Offering will once again be donated to the Canton Emergency Fuel Bank. <u>Please make checks out to: The Canton Fuel Bank</u>.




