I was called out of retirement as an auctioneer in early December to assist a family dealing with an estate in Simsbury. One of their prized possessions is a beat up free standing wooden closet or locker. The family anecdote is that it was used by Martin Luther King, Jr. when he worked the tobacco fields of Simsbury in the 1940's. I treated the item reverently and felt blessed to touch this piece of furniture that a teenaged MLK possibly used.

Dr. King was highly instrumental in getting the Civil Rights Bill passed and was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. He gave his life promoting nonviolence and peaceful protest to overcome racial inequalities in America.

In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus said "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God" (Matthew 5:9-12). This verse emphasizes the importance of promoting peace and harmony, and the idea that people who work to resolve conflicts contribute to a better world.

We are going through a time of uncertainty in our Church as we search for a new pastor while also dealing with national changes and divisions. The Diaconate strongly believes that our Congregation can be peacemakers as we go through these uncertain times without also sacrificing personal beliefs.

Happy New Year! I hope you found great joy in your experience of Christmas!

I finished my Christmas shopping somewhat early this year and as all my children are in Colorado, I forced myself to keep it simple. Once I had mailed or delivered all my cards and gifts, I noticed that I was missing the frenzy a bit. So, on a few days when I didn't have a full list of things to accomplish, I wandered around the Shoppes just to be part of the scene and see what might catch my attention. It was delightful, and, yes, I did buy a few things, but mostly I just wandered, looking around to see what drew me in.

We call our hiking experience at Canton Center Church the **Happy Wanderers**. We explore public use trails, most maintained by the Canton Land Conservation Trust or part of the CT trail system. The age of our hikers ranges from five to 95. As we wander, we talk about how to find our way in the woods, what landmarks and blazes to look for, what obstacles might need a bit more of our attention, and who in the group might need a little assistance.

There is always something that the woods teach us when we wander; there is always something to notice. Our Canton Center Church congregation was so amazingly generous during the Thanksgiving to Christmas holiday season!



\*You donated baked goods and money that provided at least 5 apple pies, 8 pumpkin pies, 5 dozen cupcakes, 12 dozen cookies and brownie bites, whipped topping, and 2 bags of gluten free cookies to the Canton Senior and Social Services Community Thanksgiving Dinner. (We provided plastic bags so people could take home left-over desserts to enjoy later.)

\*You donated toys as well as \$1100 worth of gift cards to Canton Senior and Social Services, and an additional \$1135 worth of gift cards for Wellmore's clients. These contributions helped so many people have a wonderful Christmas.

\*You donated well over 300 items to be given to the residents of Cherry Brook Healthcare Center, ensuring that each resident received several small gifts.

\*You donated many hats, mittens, gloves, scarves, and socks that will be distributed to various organizations in our area in January.

\*You contributed to *The Christmas Fund* for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund which provide direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties.
