Message from the pastor...

As we journey through Lent and prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter, I'm excited to share an opportunity for our church to make a real difference in the lives of those in our community. We can share the joy of the season hosting a truly remarkable organization, Amy's Angels, to showcase its incredible impact on Connecticut residents. Hosting this amazing Simsbury-based non-profit will not only raise awareness of their work but also embody the spirit of compassion and service that defines our church and faith.

Many of you know I've been visiting the son of a dear friend and former detective partner, Jack Casey. Jack Jr., an extraordinary 35-year-old, has courageously battled brain cancer for eleven years and is now on hospice. Through my visits, I learned from Jack Sr. that Amy's Angels has been a tremendous source of support for Jack Jr. & his wife, Charlotte, for the past seven years, helping them financially by paying their mortgage.

Deeply moved by this story, I decided to learn more about Amy's Angels. Meeting with Bob Fiondella, the founder and CEO was truly inspiring. I was amazed at the scope of their generosity and the countless ways they support individuals and families in Connecticut. They truly live out the spirit of compassion and service.

This Easter season, I believe we have a unique opportunity to partner with several local groups to host Amy's Angels and bring their incredible story to the Farmington Valley. I have requested assistance from our Bridge the Gap team and our Church Missions committee and would love others to join us in hosting and marketing the event. I've already begun laying the groundwork for this initiative. I've contacted the Canton and Avon Police Departments, (Captain Andrew Schiffer and Chief Paul Melanson, respectively, with whom I have established relationships,) to partner with us, M & T Bank in Avon (where the branch manager, Flora Pretashi, is enthusiastic about partnering), Canton Social Services (Kara McConville), and Rev. Amy Johnson, minister of the Canton Community Baptist Church. Both Kara and Rev. Amy's congregation is on board to partner.

What needs to be done? Quite simply, I would be very grateful for someone to help design a flyer/poster describing the event, including the names of our partners, to place in and around the Farmington Valley as well as on social media. I will be meeting shortly with Bob and his daughter, Lindsey, to establish a date and time. Bob has a lengthy list of email and media (radio and TV) contacts as well.

This event, "Preparing Our Hearts for Easter," will be a chance for us to reflect on the themes of hope, sacrifice, and new life that are central to the Easter story. It's an opportunity to connect with our neighbors, introduce them to the inspiring work of Amy's Angels, and demonstrate the love and compassion that motivates us as people of faith.

I encourage each of you to visit Amy's Angels website and learn more about their work. You'll be amazed by the scope of their impact and the many ways they are making a difference in our Connecticut communities.

I'm confident that this event will not only be a blessing to Amy's Angels but also a powerful witness to the love and generosity of our church. More importantly, it's an opportunity to share the joy of Easter by supporting an organization that embodies the true meaning of kindness, generosity, and love.

Please share your thoughts on how we can make this "Journey to the Cross, Journey to Joy" a resounding success.

WORSHIP MINISTRY

This winter is proving to be a return to normal cold and snowy conditions that have the potential to impact Church Sunday activities.

Within the Church By-Laws, the Diaconate is given responsibility for Church services, and with that comes the task of making the determination to have or cancel service. On almost every Sunday, various members and/or committees will have spent valuable time planning events, and the Diaconate understands that some members commonly travel considerable distances to reach Canton Center. Both of our most recent ministers, Rev. Brenda and Rev. Kurt, have commuted and do commute to the church from a distance, from Windsor and Colebrook respectively. The cancellation decision is not easy and the conditions always vary. If the inclement weather is upon us, the Diaconate try to coordinate and obtain the Minister's opinion about travel conditions. If the storm is forecast in advance, we discuss the matter and make the most reasonable determination. In any situation, our focus is upon the safety of the Church community.

When we have advance warning, the Church office will send an email notice to those who have provided their contact information, and the church phone message may be updated. In all cases we try to notify TV Channel 3, WFSB, and add our name to the list of cancellations under "First Cong Church Canton Ctr". The good news is that soon spring will be upon us and winter weather cancellations will be an issue of the past; drive safely.



BOOK/BIBLE CONVERSATION

Starting on Tuesday March 11th and every other Tuesday (next: March 25th) I will lead a dialogue/study, with our membership and others who would like to join from 10:00 - 11:30, as we discuss by acclaimed author, Phillip Yancey, What's So Amazing About Grace? Revised and Updated: The Key to Transforming a Broken World.

Years ago, I read the original writing of this book and began reading the new revised edition with a reflection guide. We will enjoy coffee, tea, water, and snack as we share our thoughts and comments as well as any biblical connection to our conversation.



Here is a brief summary of What's So Amazing About Grace?

It's the most powerful force in the universe, our only hope for love and forgiveness, and a foretaste of eternal life: amazing, radical, life-changing grace. Millions of lives have been changed by award-winning author Philip Yancey's startling exploration of grace at street level. Grace is the one thing the world can't duplicate, the healing force we need, and the key to transforming a broken world. In this revised and updated edition of his personal and provocative book, Yancey offers true portraits of grace's life-changing power. These stories, set in the midst of life's stark realities, evoke such questions as:

- If grace is God's love for the undeserving, how do I get it?
- How well are we dispensing grace to a world that knows far more of strife and unforgiveness than it does of mercy?
- Can grace make a difference in the midst of such atrocities as the Nazi holocaust, and how can it withstand the brutality of hate?

With powerful stories, rich theology, and practical suggestions, Yancey challenges us to become living answers to a world that desperately needs to know, *What's So Amazing About Grace?*

This Sunday, March 2nd, there will be a signup on the Script table for those interested in joining and the book costs \$14.60 from Amazon. It truly is an 'Amazing' read. Phillip Yancey is not only an exceptional writer but once considered himself an atheist as he now shares his love for our Lord.
