🀲 A Message from Pastor Kurt...

For as in one body we have many members and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. ~Romans 12:4,5

Several years ago, I read an amazing fact about Redwood Trees. It brings to mind how important unity and connection is within nature, especially with these majestic, gigantic, California trees. Unity and connection are similarly just as important in our personal lives and our congregation. Let me elaborate.

Are you aware that the Coast Redwood tree can reach heights of 400 feet, 100 feet wide and grow two to ten feet a year. They can weigh over one and a half million pounds and live 2000 years. These regal behemoths, some of the tallest living things on earth, stand their ground against the toughest of storms and are impervious to the strongest winds. Logically, one would reason with their size and weight, the taproot would grow deep into the earth with countless other roots to withhold such a massive tree. What's truly remarkable is that their individual root systems are surprisingly shallow. Their strength and resilience do not come from a deep, singular taproot, but rather from an intricate network of roots that intertwine and connect with those of their neighboring trees. It's in this interconnectedness that they find the stability to weather storms and stand tall for centuries. Just like these towering trees, we strengthen our individual faith journey when we are deeply connected to one another. Getting to know each other, truly understanding the diverse stories and experiences within our congregation, is like our roots beginning to intertwine. As we share our lives, our joys, and our challenges, we create a network of understanding and empathy that provides a strong foundation for us all.

In the coming weeks the Diaconate and I will hold a second hour and engage our congregation to share some of their life stories as we seek to know one another on a deeper level than sharing a coffee and small talk during our time of Fellowship. We are not looking to share deep, dark secrets, only those things that you care to share with questions that resonate with you such as:

- Where did you grow up, and what are one or two vivid memories from your childhood?
- What is a family tradition that is special to you?
- What was a favorite subject or activity you enjoyed in school?
- What is a hobby or passion that brings you joy and energy?
- What is a place you've traveled to that has had a significant impact on you?
- What is a book, movie, or piece of music that has resonated with you deeply?
- What is a simple pleasure in life that you appreciate?
- What is a value that is important to you and why?
- What is something you've learned in life that you would share with others?
- What is a challenge you've overcome that has shaped who you are? (Share only if comfortable)
- What is something you are grateful for right now?
- What brought you to this congregation?
- What is one aspect of your faith journey that has been meaningful to you?
- Is there a particular Bible verse or spiritual teaching that resonates with you?
- What is a funny or memorable anecdote you'd be willing to share?
- What is a hidden talent you have?
- If you could have any superpower, what would it be and why?

This May and the months that follow, let us be inspired to intentionally cultivate deeper connections with one another, allowing our "roots" to intertwine through meaningful conversations and genuine care. By supporting each other in our faith we too can stand tall and strong, weathering the storms of life together and reflecting the enduring love of God. May our connections deepen and our community flourish, just like a thriving redwood forest.



Please save the date as we will need many volunteers to have a successful event.




